- ▶ As part of sustainable family plots, coffee represents the primary source of income for many Tzeltal families, helping them cover needs that the land does not directly provide for (education, hygiene, health, etc.).
- ▶ Capeltic coffee is grown and harvested by Tzeltal families in the Northern Jungle of Chiapas, Mexico, at altitudes ranging from 900 to 1,400 meters above sea level.
- ▶ Our coffee offers a floral aroma, a moderate citrus acidity, a balanced creamy body, and a smooth flavor with notes of chocolate, hazelnut, caramel, and red fruits.
- ▶ By cultivating it in harmony with Mother Earth, we provide you with a sustainable, high-quality product to enjoy at home.

- ▶ Capeltic is part of the Yomol A'tel group, a collective of Social and Solidarity Economy enterprises. Together, we build a fairer and more inclusive economic alternative.
