As part of sustainable agroecological production, honey production is an alternative source of income for many families, helping them meet needs that the land cannot directly provide (education, hygiene, health, and food). Honey production is based on the native flora of the Chichas region, where churqui, algarrobo, and molles are abundant at an altitude of 2,965 meters above sea level. The honey has a light yellow color, a viscous consistency, and contains nutritional and medicinal elements beneficial to human health.

By producing honey and implementing beehives in agroecological farming plots, we improve yields through pollination and live in harmony with Mother Earth. We offer a high-quality product to share at home, contributing to the health and nutrition of families.
